

B-TM Sight Package Installation Instructions

WARNING: Be sure the rifle is unloaded and that there is no cartridge visible in the chamber

Samson Manufacturing recommends checking with Sturm, Ruger & Co., Inc. on the proper way to remove the factory sights from your 10/22®.

When replacing the factory Ruger sights, it is recommended that you mount your 10/22® in a padded gun vise to securely hold the rifle in place during the process.

Front Sight:

- 1. Remove factory front iron sight
 - a. Place the 10/22® in a padded vise
 - b. Add a few drops or spray some penetrating oil into the dovetail
 - c. Allow the oil to fully penetrate the dovetail (this could take several hours or even overnight)
 - d. Tap out the factory sight, from left to right using a brass or steel punch and mallet, with short steady blows until the factory sight assembly slides out of the dovetail and off the barrel—*Be careful not to damage the barrel*
 - e. Clear the factory dovetail of any loose metal or dirt
- 2. Install the Samson Manufacturing B-TM Front Sight
 - a. Add a drop of oil into the dovetail
 - b. Slide the front sight base into dovetail from right side of the gun and center over the barrel
 - c. Carefully add one drop of the included blue thread locker to the set screw
 - d. Install the set screw into the vertically threaded hole in the center of the front sight base. Tighten set screw with 5/64" hex key until snug
 - e. Use included B-TM Sight Adjustment Tool to install sight post into threaded hole

Rear Sight:

It is not necessary to remove the factory rear sight to install the B-TM Rear Sight. If you choose to remove the factory rear sight, consult with Ruger or your gunsmith.

- 1. Remove the 4 set screws in the top of the 10/22® receiver with a small flat head screwdriver (not included) and set aside
- 2. Place B-TM Rear Sight rail on top of receiver and insert the 4 included set screws into holes
- 3. Using small flat head screwdriver, tighten screws until snug. Do not use thread locker, as it may drip into the receiver and cause potentially dangerous malfunctions

NOTE: Prior to sighting in, add a small drop of thread locker to the front sight post, wipe off the excess and adjust the front sight post as necessary using the included B-TM Sight Adjustment Tool



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
